Abstract

For the first time the rich collection of early Australian maps printed in books has been identified and described. In all, this guide offers an annotated listing of nearly 600 maps and charts of Australia and its parts published in English and foreign-language books between 1780 and 1830.

Tom Perry and Dorothy Prescott have compiled an extensive bibliography which not only supplements existing map catalogues but provides an essential tool for map collectors, map dealers, librarians, and students and teachers of historical geography, cartography and maritime history.

During her career she has been Map Curator at the National Library of Australia, The University of Melbourne Library and the University College Library, Ibadan, Nigeria. She has written many articles on maps and map librarianship and is a joint author of Frontiers of Asia and Southeast Asia (1977). Both Mrs Prescott and Dr Perry are Associates of The University of Melbourne.
