National Atlas of Sweden

The first national atlas Atlas över Sverige was published in 1953–1971 by Svenska Sällskapet för Antropologi och Geografi (SSAG). Sveriges Nationalatlas Förlag published between 1990 and 1996 a new Swedish national atlas in 17 thematic volumes. The organizations responsible for this new national atlas were Lantmäterverket (the National Land Survey), Statistiska centralbyrån (Statistics Sweden) and SSAG. The series was financed by government grants.

This volume, "Public Health and Health Care", complements the thematic volumes in the National Atlas of Sweden and is published in co-operation with the National Land Survey and the National Board of Health and Welfare (Socialstyrelsen). The first regional volume within the framework of the National Atlas of Sweden, Atlas över Skåne, was published in 1999.

The National Atlas of Sweden is published in book form in Swedish and English and in a version for personal computers: *PC-Atlasen-GIS*. Many of the maps can also be viewed on the Internet, www.sna.se, where the maps in the books will be successively updated.
